
About our Outreach recipient: the Community Hospice House, which is operated by Home Health and Hospice Care. Home Health & Hospice Care is a large non-profit Visiting Nurse Association and hospice serving 25 communities in southern NH. It has its roots in the North End of Nashua, when in 1883, a group of young women began bringing food and medicine to the families of mill workers. Today the agency provides traditional home care, skilled nursing, rehabilitation therapies, Advanced Illness Management, Palliative Care, Behavioral Health and Bereavement Support groups. The Hospice Team cares for patients in their homes, in nursing homes and in the Community Hospice House. The ten suite Community Hospice House opened its doors in December of 2000 after a very successful Capital Campaign led by church member Jack Law. For more information, see http://hhhc.org/hospice.


